RULES FOR FACTORY RIFLE CLASS FOR F CLASS COMPETITION

The Factory Rifle Class (FRC) rifles are generally bolt action rifles which are purchased from retail stores or gun shops. Some of the manufacturers may be Remington, Ruger, Savage or Winchester. This manufacturers list is not all inclusive. This class is for new shooters just getting started in F Class mid range competition (600 yards) and don't wish to spend \$\$\$ for a dedicated custom F Class rifle. Also, a factory rifle is similar to a rifle that many of our club members already own for big game or varmint hunting.

This class is not NRA approved.

All F Class rules will be followed as stated in the NRA High Power Rules in Section 22 except for the rules list below.

Rifle: One purchased from a retail store or gun shop (Factory Rifle).

Exception: Savage Model 12 F open, TR or Benchrest rifles.

Stock: Must not be over 2.5 inches wide at the forend and made of wood, synthetic material or aluminum chassis as it came from the factory.

Action: Bolt, Falling Block, Rolling Block or Break Open Action. From the prone shooting position a break open action is hard to manipulate.

Barrel: Rifle manufactures barrel (stock barrel). Rebarreling must be performed by original rifle manufacturer.

Trigger: Any trigger no lighter than 2 pounds.

Scope: Any scope up to 20X. If the scope is capable of higher magnification it will be set at 20X.

Weight: 13 pounds including scope.

Caliber: Any caliber up to 35. (NRA rule)

Front Rest: Harris type bipod or bag. No mechanical rests.

Rear rest: Bag

Muzzle Attachments: Break or suppressor may be used.
