LOCATION/LODGING: Colorado Rifle Club, 76099 East 96th Ave. Byers, Co 80103. The Range is located about 8 miles east of Byers on US HWY 36, then about 9 miles North on Leader Road (52N), then one mile west on 96th Ave to the Range gate, then one mile North to the Ranges. There are first come first served travel trailer pads with power (no sewer/water) available on CRC Property. Most are 30 amp with some 50 amp sites available near the pistol ranges on the East end of the range. There is also a newly constructed dump station on property near the farmhouse.

80 shot Regional Course / Highpower Rifle Standard Course with sighters. Shooters will start in position for the rapid-fire stages. (88 shots total) Sitting to be fired immediately after Standing.

10 rnds per team member. 30 min Block Time. Unlimited Sighters

Match 13: 1000 Yards Any Rifle/Any Sight (GM2 Danny Dietz Memorial Match)

10 rnds per team member. 50 min Block Time. Unlimited Sighters

Match 14 600/1000 Prone Service Rifle Aggregate (PFC Jesse Givens Memorial Match)

Match 15 600/1000 Prone Match Rifle Aggregate (SSGT Justin Vasquez Memorial Match)

Match 16 600 Mid-range Overall Aggregate (MM2 Conrad Grims Memorial Match)

CLASSIFICATIONS: NRA classifications will be used. Individuals will compete in one of the categories list below. If there are fewer than 5 entries in a classification/category, those entries may be combined into the next higher classification/category until the 5-competitor minimum is satisfied. Unclassified competitors will compete as Masters.

RULES: Current NRA High-Power Rifle Rules and F-Class Rules will govern this tournament. Any safe ammunition is allowed. Tracer/Incendiary/ Armor piercing ammunition is not allowed on any CRC range.

Depending on participation, Electronic Targets (SHOTMARKER®) will be used.

Be sure to bring a tablet or phone so that you can perform scoring duties.

COMPETITOR DUTIES: Competitors will score and/or operate targets if not shooting. Failure to serve your assigned detail (firing, scoring, and target duties) may result in disqualification from the match.

AWARDS: Medals for 1st place, certificates for 1st, 2nd and 3rd in categories as described above.

Challenge Period: The Challenge Period ends 30 minutes after posting of the results.
