

2026 Colorado Rifle Club F-Class Long Range Iron Man

TOURNAMENT IS NRA REGISTERED

DATE: September 12, 2025.

RANGE LOCATION: Colorado Rifle Club, 76099 East 96th Ave. Byers, CO 80103. The Range is located about 8 miles east of Byers on US HWY 36, then about 9 miles North on Leader Road (52N), then one mile west on 96th Ave to the Range gate, then one mile North to the Ranges. Visit www.crci.org click on “Facilities” tab for map.

FACILITIES: Colorado Rifle Club has multiple ranges. We will be using the High Power Range for the competition and the Schuetzen Range for practice firing. There are camping spots with 30 or 50 amp electrical service available. Water and sewer hook-up are NOT available. A dump station is located near the Clubhouse. The camping fee is \$5.00 per night. Spots are available on a first come first served basis.
CLUBHOUSE: Colorado Rifle Club has a clubhouse with bathrooms and showers available to campers.

COMPETITION WAIVER: All competitors, not members of Colorado Rifle Club, should complete the online Annual Competitor Waiver prior to the first match, [CRC guest-and-competitor-waiver](#). The waiver is active for 1 year from date of submittal. Additionally, all competitors must acknowledge the waiver statement to register for a match.

TOURNAMENT SANCTION: The CRC F-Class Long Range Iron Man will be conducted as an NRA Registered Tournament.

F-CLASS POINTS SERIES QUALIFICATION:

The Colorado Rifle Club Iron Man is an F-Class points Series Qualifying match with a 105 record shot format.

ELIGIBILITY: Open to all F-Class Competitors.

ENTRY FEES: \$35.00 per competitor \$20.00 Junior competitor.

ENTRIES: Advance entries are required. Entries will only be through Practiscore under **CRC F-Class Long Range**. There will be no day of entries. Competitors may request to withdraw from the match while the registration window is open for a refund minus the Stripe processing fee. Should the Match be canceled due to inclement weather your registration fee will be refunded. No-shows will forfeit entry fees.

EVENT SCHEDULE: All club matches will start at 07:30 so competitors can assist opening the pits, setup of the targets, wind flags, and firing line, unless prior notification is provided via email.
Competitors should check the CRC website (crici.org) for any cancellation notices prior to traveling to the range.

RULES: Current NRA F-Class Rules will apply, please reference, [NRA-2025-F-Class-Rulebook](#)

Ammunition must be appropriate for the rifle used (see “Divisions” below). Tracer/Incendiary or steel core ammunition is not allowed.
Match Director decisions are final.

CLASSIFICATIONS: NRA classifications will be used. There will be awards for each class and division for overall rank. Unclassified competitors will compete as Masters, unless there are 5 or more unclassified competitors.

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DIVISIONS: There will be 3 divisions for this Event (subject to the limitations above):

- 1) F-Class Open Rifle [NRA F-Class Open Rifle Rule 3.1(a)]
- 2) F-Class Target Rifle [NRA F-Class Target Rifle Rule 3.1(b)]
- 3) F-Practical (At Match Director discretion depending on target and E-Target system availability). Must shoot from the forward firing positions.

ELECTRONIC TARGETS: Long Range and Palma: at 1000 yds. F-Class: LRFC at 1000 yds. Shotmarker electronic scoring will be in use for all Club matches, including the Iron Man. Shooters **MUST** bring their own tablet or cell phone with web browser capabilities to use the scoring system. Electronic target use will follow NRA F-Class Rule 10.17. The electronic target system will be configured in “Match Mode” and will induce a 7 second delay in accordance with NRA F-Class rule 10.17.1(h).

ELECTRONIC DEVICES: Small form factor chronograph devices, (Garmin, etc.) are allowed on the firing line. Weather or wind reading devices, (Kestrels) are prohibited on the line.

SQUADDING: Squadding will be random by Division, posted and downloaded to the Shotmarker system based on the entries posted the night before the match. An email notification will be sent indicating when squadding is complete and posted. No shows will be organized on-site prior to the safety briefing.

AMMUNITION & SIGHTERS: Ammunition must be appropriate for the rifle used (see “Tournaments” above). No bullet with a diameter greater than .338 will be allowed. Tracer, incendiaries, or armor piercing ammo is not permitted. Cartridges based on the 50 BMG are not permitted. Bullets must remain supersonic at the target. The match director will have the right to remove the competitor/ammunition from the firing line if the bullet is not supersonic at the target. Any ammo that repeatedly blows primers or splits cases will be ruled defective or unsafe and the competitor/ammunition will be removed from the firing line. Please ask for approval from the match director before using factory ammunition. To minimize potential damage to the Shotmarker infrastructure all competitors are expected to arrive at the range with a known zero and the correct elevation corrections required to be on target at 1000 yards. Any competitor that is unable to be on target within 5 sighting shots may be removed from the line. A competitor that is unable to stay on target may be removed from the firing line.

SCORING AND TARGET DUTIES: All able-bodied competitors will be expected to assist with the setup and take down of E-Targets, wind flags, and securing the pits. CRC members may be called upon to act as a RO to assist with the safety of the firing line.

Scoring: Relay 2 will score Relay 1 and vice versa. Score cards will be used as backup to the Shotmarker system. Scorers **MUST** monitor their shooter and ensure a shot has been taken and recorded by the Shotmarker system. Unrecorded shots, potential cross-fire shots, target failures will be dealt with in accordance with Electronic Scoring Targets, (Rules 10.17.3, 10.17.4, and 10.17.7)

EMPTY CHAMBER INDICATORS: An Empty Chamber Indicator (ECI) is required to indicate the bolt is open and the chamber is empty unless the rifle is in a case or is being used by the competitor on the firing line during preparation period or live fire (rule 10.1.1). The ECI must not be removed from the rifle until the competitor is in firing position. Upon firing the last shot the ECI must be re-inserted and the magazine removed before the competitor gets out of firing position. The rifle must be removed from the firing line with an ECI in place before the rifle is put into a case. ECI are available for purchase.

FIRING POINT POSITIONS AND EVENT TIMING: Relay 2 will dress to the immediate right of their assigned target number marker, Relay 1, will dress to the immediate right of Relay 2. Relay 1 and Relay 2 may bring all their equipment, except rifles, to the firing line upon arrival prior to the safety briefing.

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The safety briefing will commence at 08:30.

Pre-Prep: A 3 minute Pre-Prep period will be called following the safety briefing for Match 1 only. During the Pre-Prep period shooters may bring all equipment **excluding** rifles to the line and complete setup of their firing point.

Prep: A 4 minute Prep period will be called for each match. Shooters may bring their rifles to the line. Bolts must be removed and approved ECI devices installed, and magazines must be removed from repeating rifles. Muzzles must be pointed upward vertically during transport to and from the firing line, unless the rifle is transported in a case. Once on the line, shooters must maintain muzzles down range, dry firing is allowed.

Once the Prep period is called no one is allowed forward of the firing line.

IRON MAN COURSE OF FIRE:

3 matches at 1000 yards. 60 rounds for record. **String fire.**

Match 1: Unlimited sighters, 20 record shots, 30 minute block time.

Match 2: 2 sighters, 20 record shots, 22 minute block time.

Match 3: 2 sighters, 20 record shots, 22 minute block time.

SIGHTERS: During Matches 2 and 3, shooters are not required to take sighters. If a shooter elects to not take sighters, they **MUST** inform their Scorer all shots are for record.

Match 4: Aggregate of matches 1-3

Match 5: 2 convertible sighters, 15 record shots, 45 seconds shot time

Match 6: 2 Convertible sighters, 15 record shots, 45 seconds shot time

Match 7: 2 Convertible sighters, 15 record shots, 45 seconds shot time

Match 8: Aggregate of matches 5-7

Match 9: Aggregate of matches 4 & 8.

Pair Fire Procedure:

Firing will alternate between Shooter 1 and Shooter 2. Shooter 1 is on the right of the firing point and will start. Once firing commences Shooter 1 will have 45 seconds to fire their shot. Shooter 2 will score the shot. Shooter 1 will acknowledge the score. Shooter 2 then has 45 seconds to fire their shot. Shooter 1 will score the shot. Shooter 2 will acknowledge the score. Firing will continue in this alternating manner until all 15 record shots have been fired. If you fail to fire in your allotted 45 seconds, it will be recorded as a miss and the 45 seconds will start for the next shooter.

Convertible Sighters:

Shooters may convert 1 or both of their convertible sighters to record shots. If the shooter converts their first sighter, they **MUST** convert the second. The second sighter may be converted alone without converting the first sighter. Shooters **MUST** clearly announce their sighter conversions, Scorers **MUST** clearly acknowledge the conversion decision. Shooters are not required to take sighters. If a shooter elects to not take sighters, they **MUST** inform their Scorer all shots are for record.

Shot timing decisions made by the Range Officer are final.

Scoring or sighter conversion dispute decisions made by the RO or MD are final.

COACHING:

Coaching is allowed during the unlimited sighter period only. With approval of the match director, limited coaching is allowed for juniors, unclassified shooters, and F-Practical during scored fire. Coaching is not allowed for all other shooters during scored fire. Coached shooters during record fire cannot win Match Winner or Class Awards.

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SHOT CHALLENGE: A Competitor may pay an immediate \$1.00 fee to the RO to challenge the score of their previous shot, **prior to any other shot on target.** A Pit Officer will examine the target and determine the score. Decisions of the Pit Officer are final.

CHALLENGE PERIOD: The Match Score challenge period ends 30 minutes after results are posted. Challenge fee: \$5.00 Decisions of the Stats Officer and/or Match Director are final.

AWARD SCHEDULE: Awards will be given for match winner and class winners on a tournament basis. A total of 3 or more shooters must be entered in the tournament in order to pay Match Winner. A total of five or more shooters must be entered in the tournament in order to pay 1st in class winners. There must be 3 or more entries in a class to establish a class. If there are fewer than 3 entries in a class they will be combined upward with the next higher class, until a minimum of 3 competitors is achieved in the combined class. Combining of classes will start at the lowest class that does not have sufficient entries to establish that class. If the Master Class has insufficient entries to establish a class, it shall be combined upward into the HM class. The HM Class cannot be combined downward to any other established class.

MATCH CANCELLATION: Competitors should check the CRC website (crci.org) for any cancellation notices prior to traveling to the range.
