# CRC WORK BOND OPPORTUNITY / MEDICAL EQUIPMENT MANAGER

This will be a multiple year commitment requiring the person selected to be responsible for maintenance and up keep of the CRC Trauma Kit's, AED's and First aid kits. This will satisfy your CRC work bond for each year you continue to perform in this position.

You should have a working knowledge of the supplies included in these kits and be able to reorder and restock these items (at CRC's expense) as necessary. At a minimum this position requires you to place the trauma kits and AED's at designated locations around the range each spring and return them to the ranch house in the fall. Check the AED batteries and pads annually and replace them as necessary. ## WHAT IS STEEL CHALLENGE?

Ultimately, steel challenge is drag racing with a pistol and or rifle. However many people feel it is the gateway sport into the fun and excitement of the action shooting sports.

A minimum of 195 shots are fired at steel targets set at various distances from the shooter, with the farthest being 35 yards away. However most targets are much closer. The instantaneous feedback as the round strikes the steel target provides new shooters with positive feedback as to a hit or a miss.

For those just getting into the action shooting sports, steel challenge offers many advantages to other disciplines. Many people are worried about getting started in the action shooting sports because of the complexity of shooting while on the move and the amount of equipment required in order to participate. Steel challenge removes many of these concerns for new shooters.

Most stages are shot from a fixed standing position and getting started requires a minimal amount of equipment. If you have a .22 caliber pistol or rifle, a few magazines, and some ammo, you are ready to shoot your first match. The start position for 22 caliber pistols and rifles is with the firearm in your hands so you don't even need a holster. This allows new shooters to concentrate on safety and shooting fundamentals while getting into the sport.

For centerfire pistol shooters a holster is needed. In addition to the skills mentioned above, you will learn how to safely draw, fire and re-holster your firearm.

If you own a pistol caliber carbine you're welcome to shoot that as well. Only pistol caliber cartridges are allowed.

Anyone is welcome to attend a steel challenge match. New shooters will attend a safety orientation before the start of the match and will be guided through the match by match staff and those they are shooting with. Our members are friendly and willing to share their advice and experience.

Steel challenge matches are held on the third Saturday of every month on the east range. Check the match schedule on the website to confirm. Please join us you'll be glad you did. mwilley6536@msn.com

Drawing and shooting while moving is not allowed without the required safety session and safety flag being displayed while using an East Range berm.

March 3rd, at Noon on the East Range, Mark Passamaneck will be running the informational range etiquette session for members to get signed off for holster work and dynamic movement on the East range. IF the Carbine match is cancelled for weather, so too will the session. It will take about an hour, and they will need to bring \$10 for their safety flag.

East Range Updates:

- 1. The 200 yard berm steel target that CRC placed has been abused, stolen and the frames shot up. As a result it is gone. We might try one more time this summer, so don't abuse it.
- 2. The targets, props, etc. near, around and in the yard, trailers, etc. South of the actual East berms are owned by several entities and are NOT for casual use by members. Many targets have been taken and then abused and ruined over the past few years.

## **CRC CLUB LEGACY .45 ACP BRASS**

CRC CLUB LEGACY .45 ACP BRASS: Larry Kelly was a long-time member of CRC who passed away a few years ago. In addition to the many things Larry did for the club, he left us 2,000 to 3,000 rounds of probably once fired .45 ACP brass. This is not what I would call First Quality brass. Some cases have "dinged" mouths typical of hard ball ammo fired in service pistols. The dings must be removed before sizing and the cases will probably crack after a few reloads. Others got wet in storage and may be difficult to clean. I am sure there are some good cases for someone willing to sort and spend some extra effort.

I am putting out a call to see if there are people that want to use this brass to help the club. Would any match directors want to use some or all of it for prizes to encourage new (or older) shooters that have more time than money to spend on reloading? Are any members just looking for brass? Match directors will have first claim, general members should contribute to the club in some fashion in return for the brass.
